

### THE NEIGHBORHOOD

- Population Estimate: 9,376 (down 8% since 2000)
- Housing Stock: Roughly 3,000 parcels. 3% single family detached homes, 35% single-family attached homes, 8% 2-unit homes and duplexes, 54% apartments
- Income: 58% of households have annual income of less than \$50,000.
- Demographics: 53% White, 33% African American, 7% Hispanic, 5% Asian, 1% American Indian or Alaskan Native, & 8% two or more races.
- Between 2000 and 2016, White population +114%, African American population -57%, Asian population +224%. Hispanic population + 69%.





EST. 1988


- Annually raises and awards the Gary Bronson Memorial College Scholarships.

# TRANSIT COMMITTEE EST. 2018


### Goals:

### ZONING COMMITTEE

- When selected by councilwoman, convenes community meeting with variance requestors to solicit feedback and gauge support/opposition.
- Relays outcome of community meeting to the city's Zoning Board of Adjustment. It is the ZBA, not CPN, that is the ultimate decider on variance requests.
